WONDERS OF THE UNDERWATER WORLD ECLIPSE 2024

Take a virtual dive into the ocean with Marie and Steve, who specialize in capturing the colors, behaviors and amazing life of the underwater world. Their subjects range from the giant whale sharks, humpback whales and last month in Dominica, sperm whales) to the tiny (nudibranchs, crustaceans, cephalopods and other marvelous critters). Their range spans the gamut, from technicolor coral reefs to the otherworldly, photographing larval and migratory forms of life of the deep sea while blackwater diving.

Marie and Steve also enjoy training their cameras on celestial phenomena and are looking forward to photographing the eclipse of April 8, 2024 in Texas. This will be their 4th total solar eclipse to witness. From their shaky beginnings as eclipse chasers from a small boat in the open ocean while on a dive trip to Bonaire in the southern Caribbean in 1998, they honed their techniques during the 2017 eclipse in Jackson, Wyoming and the 2019 eclipse in the Elqui Valley of Chile (nicely coinciding with their 30th wedding anniversary!). The Covid pandemic thwarted their plans to photograph the eclipses of 2020 and 2021 in Chile's Lake District and the Southern Ocean near South Georgia, so they have been eagerly awaiting April 8, 2024 to again experience these magical minutes. They will discuss their techniques and lessons learned along the way.

They have been featured speakers at multiple camera clubs in the San Diego area, as well as the Sedona Camera Club in 2014. Marie and Steve's images have been exhibited at the La Jolla Athenaeum, San Diego Natural History Museum, Oceanside Museum of Art, Birch Aquarium and the Smithsonian National Museum of Natural History.

Steve's photographic work incorporating medical imaging devices (radiography and CT) has been exhibited at the Mingei International Museum, the San Diego Museum of Man, Jett Gallery and included in a Museum of Photographic Arts show, Hidden Worlds. Steve was also represented in a show at San Diego Art Institute called Beyond the Age of Reason. Marie's underwater work was featured in a two-artist exhibition at The Photographer's Eye Gallery in Escondido, CA in 2020 in a show entitled The Tonic of Wildness. In past years, Steve and Marie have contributed articles to an online magazine, Photofocus, including a series documenting their preparation for and experiences at the 2017 and 2019 eclipses.

Jim will be teaching a one session class on multi-flash and high speed sync on February 17th at the Christ Lutheran Church in Sedona from 2pm until 4:30pm.

This class will provide an introduction to flash photography, with an emphasis on off-camera flash setups and techniques and will also cover the basics of high speed flash sync. Participants will learn the uses and benefits of flash photography, the types of flash units and triggers available, the ways they can be deployed, and the camera and flash settings involved. The class will last around 2 1/2 hours, (depending on the amount of discussion, which is encouraged), and will include demonstrations of some of the techniques discussed.

Analyze First, Post Processing Second LEARNING SESSION



MACRO WORKSHOP

With Amy Horn Took Place on January 30th

Fifteen participants joined Northern Arizona University photography teaching professor Amy Horn for her Macro Workshop on January 30th. Through hands-on demonstrations and setups Amy explained how to capture macro images in several different scenarios.

Tables were set up with partitions between each photographer's station and the subject matter varied between unusual rocks, feathers, flowers and wings. Photographic equipment used included cameras with macro lenses, tripods, a focusing rail, on and off camera flash systems and flash diffusers.

Amy is the co-author of <u>The Art of Macro Photography</u>, an amazing book with gorgeous photographs. She will be teaching a one-day class on Digital
