# GREG HOLDEN August Speaker

A Virtual Presentation



Holden is a photographer from Longmont, Colorado, who uses his photography to share with others how he sees the world. He enjoys creative photos of little scenes often overlooked by others rather than postcard landscapes. Although he won't pass by a chance to photograph a beautiful landscape or a tranquil sunset, he'd rather be exploring abandoned places and capturing the details of the layers of paint and rust on a discarded automobile.

Photographer Elliot Erwitt once said, "To me, photography is an art of observation. It's about finding something interesting in an ordinary place...I've found it has little to do with the things you see and everything to do with the way you see them."

Greg Holden will discuss how he sees the world around him and how he captures that through his photographs. He will discuss his approach for finding different viewpoints in common scenes and how he creates interesting abstract images by isolating a part of a scene. Whether it is iPhone photos taken in his kitchen or DSLR images from local parks, Greg's photos will demonstrate that you do not have to travel to exotic locations or spend hours using software manipulation to make creative images.

Greg enjoys searching used bookstores for photo collections and has over 180 books (as of Oct 2023) on and about photography. He finds inspiration from master photographers and a wide range of subjects, such as: the close-up beach studies by Minor White, the early portraiture of Steichen and Stieglitz, and street scenes by Andre Kertesz. He enjoys teaching others and sharing his passion for photography and speaks at camera clubs near his home in the greater Denver area, but also speaks and judges virtually to clubs across the US. A mailchimp email describing the new photo submission and photo review processes was sent to you a couple of weeks ago. Of special importance are the three categories of monthly photo submission.

### **CRITIQUES:**

This category is for members that are also Peer Reviewers. Critiques will include comprehensive comments based on the Arts Edge Framework about such things as in-camera techniques, post processing, composition, storytelling, overall impact of the photo.

#### **FEEDBACK:**

This is for all members. This is a good place to submit a photo if, for example, you have a question about it that you might like answered. Any member in turn may provide feedback. (But no feedback is guaranteed).

### **SHARE ONLY:**

This is for all members. This could be used, for example, to show off a particularly impactful photo, technique or style. No comments from other members will be possible.

Similar to last year, a total of 14 digital submissions are allowed per year. We anticipate that all or most submitted photos will be presented in the slide show at the monthly meeting.
